# **Easy And Effective Tips For Training Your Dog**

The type of leash, collar, and harness are very important to take into consideration when training a dog. The bigger the dog the more secure these items will need to be. Also if one has a dog that pulls on the leash a harness should be used to control the animal opposed to a choke chain or collar. The right equipment is essential to dog training.

In order to train a well-mannered dog you should aim to begin training your dog in its first four months of life. These first four months are its primitive years of development and growth. If you begin training during this period, you will have a better chance of raising a good dog.

Your dog wants someone to be in charge. If it isn't you, your dog may try to take the job. Dogs want leaders who provide stability and security. Be a good leader by being consistent, competent, firm, gentle, kind, and a good provider. Your dog will be happy to follow you!

When you are training your dog, do not blame it for bad behavior if it is sick. You should never force a dog to do obedience training when it is not feeling well. Take your dog to the vet to see what is making it sick, and put off the training until it is doing better.

Teach your dog the "down" command. This command is useful to build upon, or on its own in emergency situations. A dog that knows his "down" command well can drop to the ground at a moment's notice in a testy situation, making it a great command to keep on hand for safety's sake.

If your dog is bored, try making him work for his meals. There are toys and puzzles for dogs that require the dog to discern between scents. There are toys that make the dog think creatively to get food out of a chamber. Either way you go, your dog will have his scavenging instincts fulfilled!

Make your dog training fun for both you and your animal. If you are not having fun then more than likely, your dog is not either. This can lead to you both having a bad experience. The more fun you can make your dog training the faster it will go for both of you. Try to look at dog training as a game, and not as a chore.

To help your puppy learn good bathroom habits, training them using a crate is a great idea. Dogs don't like using the bathroom near where they sleep or spend much time, so take advantage of this natural preference of dogs and teach them to use the bathroom outside or in a desired area.

Recall training with your dog should always begin in a safe, enclosed space. A fenced backyard or other outdoor enclosure is the perfect place to start. This will allow you to keep your dog safe while you practice the recall command until the dog is 100% trustworthy, while still challenging him with outdoor distractions.

Physical punishment does not work, and can hinder training. Never ever hit your dog, especially when training. While it may appear to work because the dog stops the behavior, in reality they have only learned to fear you and not do that behavior in your presence. So toss out that rolled up newspaper and break out some tasty treats instead.

Only ask your dog to do something if you know you can follow through with the command. If you tell your dog to sit and he does not do it, you must impose a consequence. If you don't, your pet will begin to view your instructions as something they can choose to do.

When training your dog, make sure to enforce all commands you give. Do not repeat them over and over, but issue them once firmly and make sure your pet follows through. Do not let your dog ignore a command or else he will think that you are not serious and will disregard most of the training session.
