German Shepherd Training: Various Uses of Crate

Before you ever bring home a dog, make sure that you have everything you need. You must have: sturdy food and water bowls; high quality dry dog food; a comfortable bed; a crate/kennel in the right size for the potential dog; and a proper leash and collar or harness. By having everything in place, you will refrain from a lot of hurrying around and uncertainty with a new dog or puppy.

The crate has various uses. Properly trained dogs can be taught to consider their crate as alternative to den, a wild dog's haven. When possible always keep the crate in a central area so that the dog learns to understand that it's there and obtainable at all times. He will begin to seek it out when he is tired and even when he is frightened. It should also provide him comfort during summer and keep him warm during winter.

To help with housebreaking a new puppy, keep him in a towel-lined crate or kennel at night. For the initial couple of weeks, take him out every two hours and let him go to the chosen spot to do his business. When over, thoroughly praise him and he'll begin to make the association between being outside and relieving himself. Avoid keeping him in there for over four or five hours unless it's overnight. He may not be able to hold it thus defeats the goal of potty training.

Apart from training, the crate is also important when traveling especially air travel as it keeps your dog and those around him safe. You just have to get him used to it before your trip to prevent stress.

Remember that [German Shepherd training](#) takes a bit of knowledge and even skill to get right. If you aren't giving it all you got, you are lowering the result that you could have on your dog's obedience.
