Make sure you're not reinforcing an undesirable behavior. You don't want to give your dog treats or special attention during training if they're not performing the task properly. If you do, then they'll think you're pleased and continue to do the thing that they're doing, and that won't improve.

If you have an older dog, get a nice bed made of memory foam to ease the stress on his old bones. It's also a good idea to get a bed with a Mylar backing to help older dogs stay nice and warm. A removable synthetic fleece cover, will also add extra padding and warmth for older dogs.

When you train your dog, you don't have to train him to do something that he's not used to doing. You should do; however, you must train him to behave in a way that will fit in with your family. You must train him to be a good dog, and you should try to walk with him or her a lot of the time. It's a lot of drama.
